

# Friends of Liverpool Monuments



The emblem of the 'Friends' is a bronze statue, depicting a standing Grecian maid 'Temperance'. It now stands in the garden of Mazenod Court. This was erected to honour Hannah Mary Thom (born 24/11/1817, died 31/12/1872), who was the lady superintendent of nurses in the Holy Cross area of city. Originally this was a memorial drinking fountain which stood in Marybone. The poor Irish of the area saved their pennies so they could pay for a memorial to honour this much loved English lady, the wife of the Rev. John Hamilton, a well known Unitarian Minister and philanthropist.

The inaugural meeting of the Friends of Liverpool Monuments took place on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> January 2005 at the Millennium Resource Centre, 1-3 St Augustine Street, Liverpool, L5 8XD.
